**From Barbara Lesko Office Coordinator at ArtQuest Tel: 610-332-1330:** You are welcome to come and photograph the Steel Stacks campus at any time; the venue is public. There is no closure time nor opening time for access to take OUTDOOR photography. There are only gates where the public is not allowed to go for safety reasons (for example: our Hoover-Mason Trestle is not yet open to the public. This is an elevated walkway that, when finished, will take the visitor across our campus and all the way down to the Sands Resort and Casino. It will give a type of "bird's-eye view" of the campus. We expect that to open sometime in July, after July 4th, if the construction schedule is on time).

Parking areas are open at most times unless there is an event on our premises. I would suggest calling to ask what is happening on the date you choose, well before your visit. There are no opening nor closing times. The campus is accessible during the work week but the weekends, especially in the summer, are often very busy with festivals and outdoor events, so it is best to plan your visit and check out the programming before you come. Summer and winter, the campus is open to the public.

We are very glad to hear that your club members enjoyed our historic site and that their pictures were successful.



## **GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT OUR CLUB**

### Would you like to be a "CURTAIN RAISER"

"Curtain Raiser Photos" are the photos shown prior to the start of regular PPC monthly meetings.

• The photos can be any subject of your choosing suitable for a general audience.

• There should be a maximum of 40 images.

• The images should be in JEPG format.

• The JEPG's should be about 1MB in size so they will display at full resolution.

• The JEPG's can be any resolution – ideally a resolution of 1440 pixels on the long side of the image matches the resolution of the projector but this is not essential.

\* The images can be on a USB Thumb/Flash, CD, DVD or on a camera memory card - But you must supply a USB Card Reader to plug into the computer.

• If you want to show the slides in a specific order number them by putting 01 thru 40 as the first part of the file name. This way the computer will order them 1-40.


